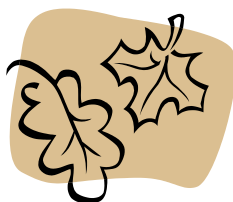

If you are interested in attending this year's Ride-In, it will be at the Balsam's again. As of right now, the price will be \$109.00 pp-pn-dbl occupancy. 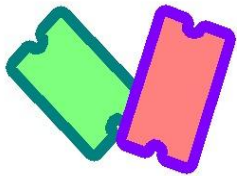
